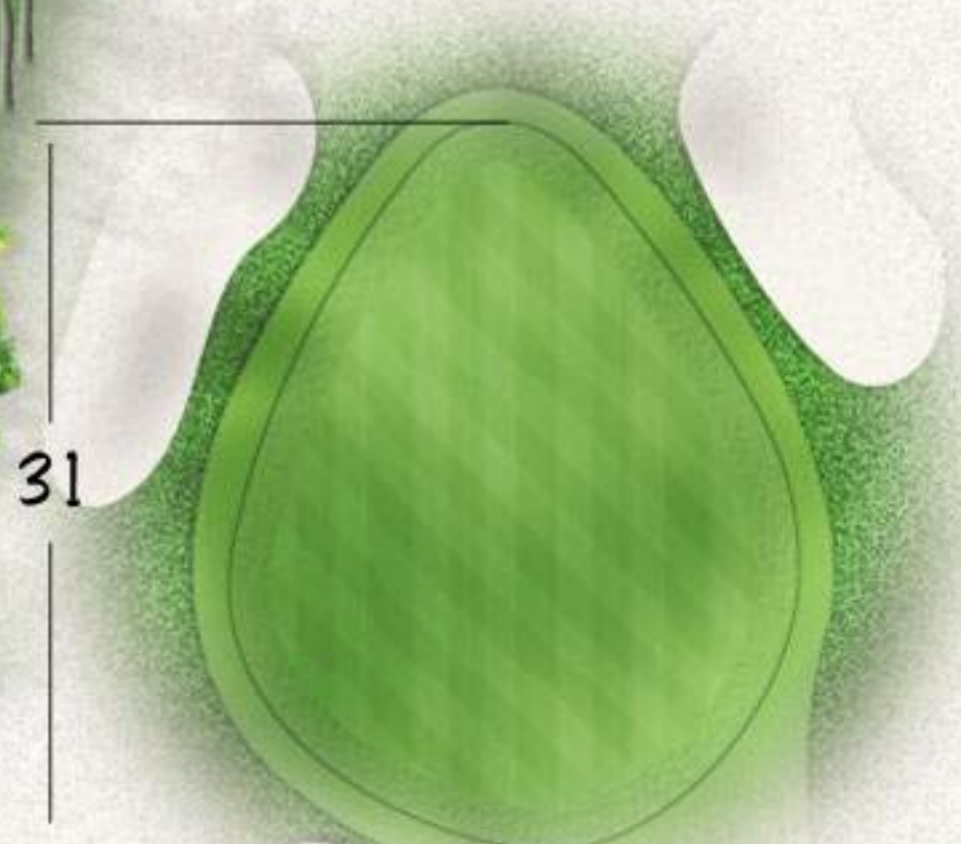
Par 3
